Consultation Windows:

- C1 = Launch and initial awareness training
- C2 = Community Questionnaire pulished
- C3 = Community consultation (event / exhibition and publicity) on evidence feedback, emerging themes, draft vision, aims and objectives for comments and endorsement.
- C4 = Consult on development site options (if appropriate / necessary)
- C5 = Share first draft plan with the community only to get comments and endorsement.
- C6 = Pre-submission consultation (including formal consultation with statutory consultees, but consult widely on content of plan).
- S = Submission to local authority.

Notes and Assumptions:

- 1. Assumes the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group (NPSG) will meet regularly to review outputs and monitor progress.
- 2. Key decisions will be taken by the Parish Council, but Terms of Reference for the NPSG should set out the degree of delegation the NPSG will have.
- 3. The Project Plan should be reviewed and amended if necessary, periodically.
- 4. Any documents or notes produced by the NPSG should be made available on Neighbourhood Plan wep pages.
- 5. The post submission stage is largely out of the hands of the NPSG and down to the local authority and appointed examiner. After submission, the process can take around 4-6 months to get the plan made.
- 6. The process may take longer or shorter time depending on the matters dealt within the plan and the pace at which the NPSG can progress.
- 7. Tasks listed are broadly sequential, although some are iterative, while some may be done in a different order within each stage. Some stages can overlap, particularly stages 1 and 2.
- 8. Should site allocation not be required, a potential saving of 1-3 months can be made from Stage 2.
